Item: Supplement to Proposed Curriculum Updates for 2010/2011 Faculty Calendar

Minor Curriculum Changes

A new course has been created. The course APS 113Y “Engineering Strategies and Practice IFP” is a parallel course to APS 111 and APS 112 for students enrolled in the International Foundation Program, a bridging program for students who have a conditional acceptance to the Faculty of Applied Science and Engineering. They are International Students who must have met all requirements except for English. The overall program is delivered through New College, but students attend, and get transfer credit for, APS 111 and APS 112: Engineering Strategies and Practice

A new 500 level course in Technology, Engineering and Global Development has been created as a CS elective, to be part of the forthcoming Globalization Certificate.

The course CIV300F has been modified to CIV300F/S and will be offered in both terms in order to accommodate student demand.

Chemical Engineering and Applied Chemistry has revised the term of delivery for CHE575S, to CHE575F.

Electrical and Computer Engineering has revised the prerequisites for 5 courses to make them available to Engineering Science students.

The Division of Engineering Science has changed one course in the Infrastructure option (AER372S is replaced with AER373S).

Mechanical and Industrial Engineering is changing the name of AER334F to MIE334F. Also, MIE414F is being changed to MIE414S.
