Re: Draft 2017 – 2022 Academic Planning Framework for review

Since we began the Faculty's self-study in spring of 2016, we have received tremendous support in the form of meaningful content and feedback.

Academic Planning is an on-going process and in addition to the consultations for the self-study, we have worked with our U of T Engineering community through our numerous task forces and working groups, ongoing Dean's Town Halls, external review meetings, the standing committees of Faculty Council, and focus groups for our Research themes.

From these diverse consultations, and with our Chairs, Directors, Vice-Deans, Associate Dean and our Research, Graduate Studies and Undergraduate committees, we have created the 2017 – 2022 Academic Planning Framework.

The framework outlines the chapters, draft goals and academic priorities for what we want to achieve over the next five years. From the framework, we will create the new academic plan along with the actions to reach the goals and the metrics to measure progress.
