



CPSIF: Conditions for Successful Applicants

As a reminder, incomplete applications will not be considered.

- You must use the application form and budget templates provided.
- The student group charter (or constitution) must be made available to the CPSIF Committee upon request.
- It is highly recommended for a representative from your student group to attend the training during Clubs Orientation hosted by the Engineering Society.
 - If you are not able to attend Clubs Orientation, it is recommended that you connect with a committee member listed on the website to review your application to ensure its good standing prior to the application deadline.
- Shortly after the end of the academic year (April 30), all student groups that received CPSIF funding are required to submit an Impact Statement, describing the impact of the funding, as well as the outcomes and achievements from their activities. You are encouraged to keep in mind the CPSIF core values, which are:
 1. Enhances the undergraduate and/or graduate student experience in the Faculty
 2. Builds an inclusive community among students and alumni
 3. Contributes to leadership and/or professional of students in the Faculty
 4. Increases the visibility, profile, and/or awareness of the Faculty, EngSoc, and/or the discipline of Engineering itself
 - In addition, you may be required to report on some of the information you provided in the application form. You should therefore keep a copy of your responses to the application form for your reference.
- Promotional and/or marketing materials should recognize supporting funding areas, which can include: Engineering Society, You're Next Career Network, the Faculty of Applied Science and Engineering at the University of Toronto, Engineering Alumni & Friends, and/or specific departments / divisions (logos to be distributed upon funding approval).
- Please keep CPSIF Committee staff informed of your group's events and projects where relevant, in particular, activities in which you will involve alumni or non-U of T students under the age of 18.
